The old £5 notes are no longer legal tender and cannot be used to pay for goods and services. Commercial banks may still exchange them for a short time. Withdrawn notes, no matter how old, can always be exchanged at the Bank of England via the post, or at the Bank itself at Threadneedle Street in London
