Tea, coffee and biscuits will be served before and after the performance. *No charge for entry, donations welcomed on exit for Christ Church.*


Poetry at Christ Church

He co-founded "Rainbow Poetry" in 1994, organising readings in Care Homes on an ecumenical basis. This work continues on an inter-faith footing. Hugh himself is an accomplished poet, and has written and produced many books of poetry. He and his wife Mary run the regular group held in the church every month on the third Thursday at 2.30 to 3.30pm, where all are welcome to join in.
