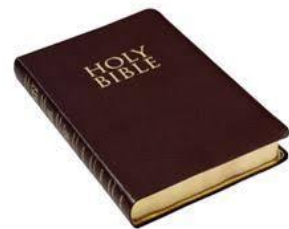
Open Church
