These are then sorted regularly and placed alphabetically along the cross- aisle benches, so please look out for cards addressed to you, and take them home!!


Parish Magazine


This poem appeared in our December magazine, and I have been asked by several people to repeat it in the lead up to Christmas.....

Christ Church Prayer Card

Dear Church Family,

We have, in the past, had a Prayer card with the names of everyone in our family, and their families, if you so wish, that would like to be prayed for regularly. This takes the form of a card, laid out in days, 1-31, when we can pray for a few people each day of the month, so everyone is prayed for once a month.

Now that we are required to comply with GDPR, we are required to not only ask you [which we have always done] if you would like to be included on the list, but also to have you record that agreement, for our records. If at any time, you wish to be taken off the card, we can only do so when a new one is produced, and it is updated, so you need to be aware of this.

Some people ask for just their first names to be included, others have their first and surname, the choice is entirely yours.
