Keeping in touch!

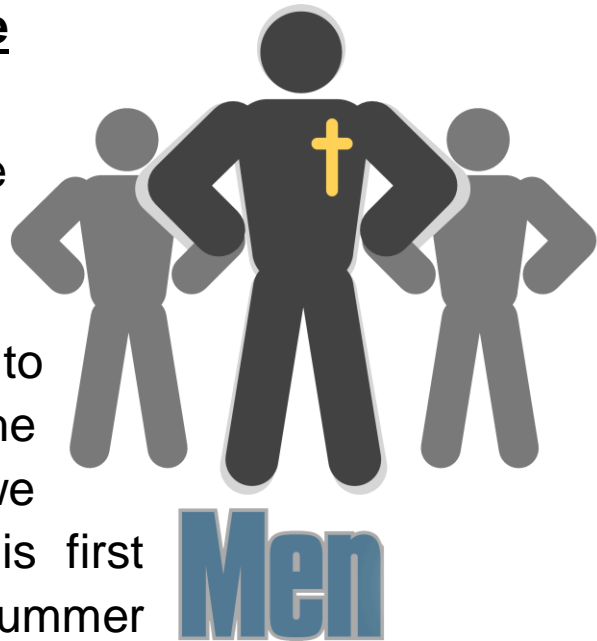
