Unfortunately, God's people do not always recognise the importance, privilege and possibilities of prayer – In consequence of this, prayer meetings are frequently poorly attended.

It was very different in the early Church, for though in the Book of Acts we read of a number of people praying "private prayers", we also have the record of a number of occasions where there were "united prayers" - in other words, where prayer meetings were held!

In Acts 1:13 we have a beautiful picture of a mixed group of Christians meeting together for the express purpose of praying together. It is the privilege of all who love the Lord to meet together to pray.
