The Liturgy of Ash Wednesday

The Greeting [Please stand]

Grace, mercy and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ be with you.

All and also with you.

cf 1 Timothy 1.2

Hymn 95 – Forty days and forty nights

Introduction [Please sit]

The priest explains the meaning of Lent and invites the people to observe it faithfully.

Brothers and sisters in Christ, since early days Christians have observed with great devotion the time of our Lord's passion and resurrection and prepared for this by a season of penitence and fasting.

By carefully keeping these days, Christians take to heart the call to repentance and the assurance of forgiveness proclaimed in the gospel, and so grow in faith and in devotion to our Lord. I invite you, therefore, in the name of the Church, to the observance of a holy Lent, by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy word. Holy God, holy and strong, holy and immortal, have mercy upon us.

The Collect

Let us pray for grace to keep Lent faithfully. *Silence is kept.*

Almighty and everlasting God, you hate nothing that you have made and forgive the sins of all those who are penitent: create and make in us new and contrite hearts that we, worthily lamenting our sins and acknowledging our wretchedness, may receive from you, the God of all mercy, perfect remission and forgiveness; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

The Liturgy of the Word

1st Reading

At the end the reader may say

This is the word of the Lord.

All Thanks be to God.

Hymn 495 Lead, kindly light [Please stand]

Gospel Reading [Please remain standing]

When the Gospel is announced the reader says

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to *N*.

All sing Glory to you, O Lord.

This is the Gospel of the Lord. All sing Praise to you, O Christ.

Sermon [Please sit]

After which a short period of silence is kept.

The Liturgy of Penitence [Please remain seated]

Let us now call to mind our sin and the infinite mercy of God.

God the Father,

All have mercy upon us.

God the Son,

All have mercy upon us.

God the Holy Spirit,

All have mercy upon us.

Holy, blessed and glorious Trinity,

All have mercy upon us.

From all evil and mischief; from pride, vanity, and hypocrisy; from envy, hatred, and malice; and from all evil intent,

All good Lord, deliver us.

From sloth, worldliness and love of money; from hardness of heart and contempt for your word and your laws,

All good Lord, deliver us.

From sins of body and mind; from the deceits of the world, the flesh and the devil,

All good Lord, deliver us.

Give us true repentance; forgive us our sins of negligence and ignorance and our deliberate sins: and grant us the grace of your Holy Spirit to amend our lives according to your holy word.

good Lord, deliver us. All

By your mighty resurrection; by your glorious ascension; and by your sending of the Holy Spirit,

good Lord, deliver us. All

By your agony and trial; by your cross and passion; and by your precious death and burial,

and by your preaching of the kingdom, good Lord, deliver us. All

By your ministry in word and work; by your mighty acts of power;

good Lord, deliver us. All

By the mystery of your holy incarnation; by your birth, childhood and obedience; by your baptism, fasting and temptation,

All good Lord, deliver us.

In all times of sorrow; in all times of joy; in the hour of death. and at the day of judgement, All Holy God, holy and strong, holy and immortal, have mercy upon us.

Make our hearts clean, O God; and renew a right spirit within us.

Father eternal, giver of light and grace, All we have sinned against you and against our neighbour, in what we have thought, in what we have said and done, through ignorance, through weakness, through our own deliberate fault. We have wounded your love, and marred your image in us. We are sorry and ashamed, and repent of all our sins. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, who died for us, forgive us all that is past; and lead us out from darkness to walk as children of light. Amen.

Ash Wednesday

Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.

The Imposition of Ashes

Dear friends in Christ, I invite you to receive these ashes as a sign of the spirit of penitence with which we shall keep this season of Lent. God our Father, you create us from the dust of the earth: grant that these ashes may be for us a sign of our penitence and a symbol of our mortality; for it is by your grace alone that we receive eternal life in Jesus Christ our Saviour. **Amen.**

All Amen.

The priest and people receive the imposition of ashes. At the imposition the minister says to each person

Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return. Turn away from sin and be faithful to Christ.

God our Father,

the strength of all who put their trust in you, mercifully accept our prayers; and because, in our weakness, we can do nothing good without you, grant us the help of your grace, that in keeping your commandments we may please you, both in will and deed; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *All* **Amen.**

The Liturgy of the Sacrament

The Peace

Since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given us access to his grace.

Taking of the Bread and Wine

[Please stand]

Hymn 97 - Lord Jesus, think on me

Merciful Father, turn us from sin to faithfulness and from disobedience to love, and prepare us to celebrate the death and resurrection of Christ our Saviour who is alive and reigns, now and for ever.

All Amen.

The Eucharistic Prayer [Please sit or kneel]

The Lord be with you

All and also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

All We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All It is right to give thanks and praise.

It is right to praise you, Father, Lord of all creation;

in your love you made us for yourself.

When we turned away

you did not reject us,

but came to meet us in your Son.

All You embraced us as your children and welcomed us to sit and eat with you.

In Christ you shared our life that we might live in him and he in us. He opened his arms of love upon the cross and made for all the perfect

sacrifice for sin.

All

On the night he was betrayed, at supper with his friends he took bread, and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to them, saying: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

All Father, we do this in remembrance of him: his body is the bread of life.

At the end of supper, taking the cup of wine, he gave you thanks, and said:

Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant,

which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins; do this in remembrance of me.

All Father, we do this in remembrance of him: his blood is shed for all.

As we proclaim his death and celebrate his rising in glory,

send your Holy Spirit that this bread and this wine may be to us the body and blood of your dear Son.

All As we eat and drink these holy gifts make us one in Christ, our risen Lord.

With your whole Church throughout the world we offer you this sacrifice of praise and lift our voice to join the eternal song of heaven:

All sing Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

The Lord's Prayer

As Jesus taught us so we pray.

All: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us.

And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

Breaking of the Bread

Every time we eat this bread and drink this cup,

All we proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

Giving of Communion

Jesus is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. Blessed are those who are called to his supper.

All Lord, I am not Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word, and I shall be healed.

Draw near with faith. Receive the body of our Lord Jesus Christ which he gave for you, and his blood which he shed for you. Eat and drink in remembrance that he died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith with thanksgiving.

Authorized words of distribution are used and the communicant replies

Silence is kept.

 All God of our pilgrimage, you have fed us with the bread of heaven.
 Refresh and sustain us as we go forward on our journey, in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Dismissal

Responsory

This is love, not that we loved God, **but that he loved us and sent his Son.** He is the sacrifice for our sins, **that we might live through him.** If God loves us so much **we ought to love one another.** If we love one another **God lives in us.**

The Dismissal Gospel

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

All sing Glory to you, O Lord.

John testified, 'I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and it remained on him. I myself did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water said to me, "He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain is the one who baptizes with the Holy Spirit." And I myself have seen and have testified that this is the Son of God.' *John 1.32-34*

At the end the reader says

This is the Gospel of the Lord. All sing Praise to you, O Christ.
