During the year John will be playing a number of pieces from Flores de Musica (which was the first book of keyboard music printed in open score in Portugal and Spain) by Manuel Rodrigues Coelho ca 1555-1635 to commemorate the 400th anniversary of its publication in 1620. For the new edition he translated the composer's preface and advice to players, and assisted with the introduction.

Dear Church Family – Covid 19

The current situation we all find ourselves living with is causing us to re-look at the normal life of the church. The Vicar and Churchwardens are closely following the guidance given by the government, the Public Health England authorities and the Church of England.

We realise that it is worrying for everyone, especially those of advanced years and those suffering existing medical conditions. To this end, **the vicar and churchwardens have taken the precautionary decision to only open the church for our normal church services for the immediate future.**

Unfortunately, this also means that we will not be serving coffee and tea after services, and we will not be open for coffee during the week to the general public.

The Church of England is now advising churches to only administer Holy Communion in one kind only for the foreseeable future, in wafers; only the priest will continue to receive the wine. The Vicar and Churchwardens had already decided to take this course a week ago.

Please do not expect the priest to place a wafer directly on your tongue, we have been advised that this is likely to increase the risk of infection, so wafers will be placed in your hand.

The priest administering communion will at all times use sanitiser before distribution.

If you feel unwell, please stay at home.

- **The advice for all continues to be:**
Wash your hands with soap and water often – do this for at least 20 seconds
- always wash your hands when you get home and into church
- use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available
- cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze
- put used tissues in the bin straight away and wash your hands afterwards
- try to avoid close physical contact, especially with people who are unwell
- Do not touch your eyes, nose or mouth if your hands are not clean

We have been advised by the legal and medical authorities to avoid physical contact, which includes shaking of hands during the peace.

TURNING TIDES can change all that, but they need help from us in just small ways.

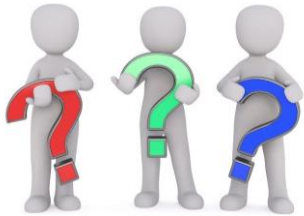

CHRIST CHURCH PRAYER NET

We support those who ask for our prayers with our '**Prayer Net**'. We are known as the 'Fishermen's church' and so our tool for prayer is a Fishing Net, hung along the front of the choir pew in the chancel on the Pulpit side of Church.



There is a table in the chancel with a card explaining the purpose of the Fishing Net, a bowl containing fish with a hook attached and pens. We invite folk to write any prayer requests on a fish and hang it on the net. Requests should be brief and not give away any information that is confidential so should only include a Christian name and a brief nature of the prayer request.

During our fortnightly Thursday Communion Service, the fish are taken off the net and placed in a basket and presented as part of our intercessions for the Church and God's World. The fish are then destroyed, and we start again in a cycle of prayer and support for those who ask us to pray with them or for them.

This net is there for us all to use, as an aid to praying for the needs of the world, situations, people, and world events. Please remember the prayer requests written on the fish; and those who have written them, and offer them silently to God in prayer.

Could I also encourage those who lead our intercessions on a Sunday to include the Fish in the Fishing Net in our Sunday intercessions?
