Summary of the Law

The Liturgy of the Word

Epistle *[Sit]*

2 Corinthians 6: 1 – 13



As God's fellow workers we urge you not to receive God's grace in vain. For he says,

'In the time of my favour I heard you, and in the day of salvation I helped you.'

I tell you, now is the time of God's favour, now is the day of salvation.

We put no stumbling-block in anyone's path, so that our ministry will not be discredited. Rather, as servants of God we commend ourselves in every way: in great

endurance; in troubles, hardships and distresses; in beatings, imprisonments and riots; in hard work, sleepless nights and hunger; in purity, understanding, patience and kindness; in the Holy Spirit and in sincere love; in truthful speech and in the power of God; with weapons of righteousness in the right hand and in the left; through glory and dishonour, bad report and good report; genuine, yet regarded as impostors; known, yet regarded as unknown; dying, and yet we live on; beaten, and yet not killed; sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; poor, yet making many rich; having nothing, and yet possessing everything.

We have spoken freely to you, Corinthians, and opened wide our hearts to you. We are not withholding our affection from you, but you are withholding yours from us. As a fair exchange – I speak as to my children – open wide your hearts also.

At the end the reader may say

This is the word of the Lord.

All Thanks be to God.

Gospel Reading *[Please stand]*

When the Gospel is announced the reader says

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to
Mark 4: 35 – end

All say **Glory to you O Lord.**

That day when evening came, he said to his disciples, 'Let us go over to the other side.' Leaving the crowd behind, they took him along, just as he was, in the boat. There were also other boats with him. A furious squall came up, and the waves broke over the boat, so that it was nearly swamped. Jesus was in the stern, sleeping on a cushion. The disciples woke him and said to him, 'Teacher, don't you care if we drown?'

He got up, rebuked the wind and said to the waves, 'Quiet! Be still!' Then the wind died down and it was completely calm.

He said to his disciples, 'Why are you so afraid? Do you still have no faith?'

They were terrified and asked each other, 'Who is this? Even the wind and the waves obey him!'

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

who has spoken through the prophets.

We look for the resurrection of the dead,
and the life of the world to come.

Update on re-opening for coffee

Following the Government's announcement last Monday of the postponement of the full lifting of restrictions, the planned re-opening for coffee during the week will now not take place until **Tuesday 20th July.**

The PCC has now agreed to open again for **coffee from Tuesday 20th July, on Tuesday and Wednesday mornings and Thursday afternoons,** Coffee and tea will be served between 10.30am and noon Tues and Weds, and 2.30 and 4pm Thurs.



Regrettably, as far as Sundays are concerned, there would be so many of us wanting to stop for coffee after services, we would be unable to maintain distancing, and also we are hoping to have work starting on the west end of the church at some time in the coming months, so refreshments can only be served at the east end, with waitress service only during the week.
